34/19 GRANT APPLICATIONS & FEEDBACK FORMS RECEIVED

Members noted grant feedback forms from:

- Stotfold Guide Association (Rainbows), £1,300 for flags for official occasions and parades
- Friends of Roecroft Lower School, £1,500 for school stage curtains
- First Stotfold Scouts, £450 for x2 Cadac gas cooking appliances
- Magpas, £1,000 for emergency helicopter fuel
- Autism Bedfordshire, £200 for social activities for Loads of Autistic Fun Group

Members considered new applications for funding (budget available £9,703).

Grants are awarded where the money is to be used for the direct benefit of the area, or part of it, or all or some of its inhabitants, and benefit obtained must be commensurate with the expenditure incurred. The decision of whether benefit would be in the interest of the area, or its inhabitants, and whether it would be commensurate with the expenditure incurred is made by the Council. Grants are awarded at the Council's discretion.

Members were reminded that as the Council has adopted the General Power of Wellbeing, no consideration into available powers is required. However, we may not go against any existing power which specifically prohibits something.

Councillors Collier and Mrs Bundock left the room whilst the application from the Roecroft Centre Charitable Trust was considered. Councillor Mrs Hyde declared an interest in the grant application from Stotfold Mill Preservation Trust, as their application refers to potential grant funding from the Eleemosynary Charity of William Field, of which she is a (non-Council appointed) Trustee.
