Town Council comments: Object on the grounds that the proposal is considered to be overdevelopment of the site, there is inadequate off-road parking provision, out of keeping with surrounding properties and would be detrimental to the street scene by creating a terrace in a street of semi-detached properties.

Land to the rear and side of East Lodge, Hitchin Road, Fairfield Park

Outline Application: 18 No. dormer bungalows on area of open land.

Town Council comments: Object on the grounds that the proposed development would be situated outside the settlement envelope of Fairfield in open countryside, in an elevated position beyond the tree-line surrounding Fairfield Park and as such, would be visible from a distance. The Planning Inspectors Inquiry 1998 for the proposed development of the Fairfield Park area (para 9.24) found that built development of the site proposed in this application would severely detract from the setting of the adjacent Listed Building, and notes that the same site proposed in this application is situated outside the line of trees enclosing open land. The proposed site is not considered to be brownfield as for most of the last century it has been used for agricultural purposes.
